Life as a student

Our 'Life as a Student' sessions can be an important dimension in decision-making and are available to groups both at your school and at Leeds Sixth Form College. Students will be able to discover what it's really like at college and will be able to understand their future options to help them plan their post-16 education.

Campus Tours

Our popular and entertaining campus tours are the perfect way for students to visit the college and discover the opportunities we have on offer, as well as our amazing facilities.

Progression activities

Our fabulous targeted sessions can be booked for specific groups of students to help ease the nerve-wracking transition from school to college. The content and length of these sessions can be written specifically to match the needs of any particular group of students. They will include all the information needed to aid the transition process, covering a wide range of topics.

Transition Talks

These sessions are aimed specifically at year 11 students who have applied for a course at Leeds Sixth Form College but are apprehensive or nervous about the interview process or starting the college in September. Our small group sessions build students' confidence and help them prepare for life at college.

CV Support

These sessions offer students the opportunity to understand the components of a CV and understand the skills and experience they may need for a chosen career. The aim is for the students to write a fun and engaging CV with the use of role-play, while also ensuring they include the important information that fulfills the requirements of a successful CV. This will give the students a chance to see how essential it is to promote their abilities, skills and knowledge so they stand out from the crowd.

Your Route to

This session is aimed at encouraging students to research their career route, looking at what's essential to reach their long-term goals and allowing students to take control of their own personal development.

Skills workshops

These activities look at essential and transferable skills for the sector students are interested in, evaluating their own personal development, helping them identify their strengths and areas of improvement.

A-Z Careers!

A fun activity to get any age group scratching their heads! A-Z Careers takes around 30 minutes to complete and can be shortened should you want an icebreaker instead of a fully fledged activity. Students can work in teams or individually thinking of as many careers as they can using each letter of the alphabet: fun, fast paced and a fantastic game to show a plethora of different careers available and how they can get there.

Mythbusters!

This game is a short activity that supports transition. The game seeks to dispel common misconceptions that students might have about Leeds Sixth Form College and teach them some interesting facts through a true or false game.

Pathways

Entry Requirements

The general entry requirements are five GCSEs graded 9-4 including English and maths (or equivalent) and three additional GCSE qualifications at grade 9-4 or BTEC equivalents. Individual subject entry requirements vary, you can see these in our prospectus or on our website.

Omega

A Levels over 2 years (possibly 4 depending on progress). Applications for medicine/veterinary/dentistry, Oxbridge or Russell Group Universities will require at least 2 traditional subjects such as maths, further maths, English literature, physics, biology, chemistry, history, geography, and modern foreign languages.

Zeta

3 A Levels over 2 years in a choice of subjects. Possible destinations include a university degree at Russell Group or other universities or higher apprenticeship.

Gamma

2 or 3 A Levels over 2 years in a choice of subjects including applied A Levels. Possible destinations include a University degree at a variety of universities or higher apprenticeship.

Delta

Designed for students aged 16-18 who aspire to study A levels but do not yet have the foundation at GCSE level to do so. Students will study a package of 5 GCSEs in year 1 and on successful completion at grades 9-4 will go on to study A levels in year 2 and 3.

Delta (5 GCSEs programme only)

For this pathway, there are no fixed entry qualifications and applicants may or may not have previously studied GCSEs. Our experienced staff will consider the individual's educational background, qualifications and experience of each applicant. The requirement for entry is that students must have a reasonable chance of securing grade 4 or above in each of the subjects to be taken at the end of the year of study.

Application process

1 search for a course

Search our website, attend an event, just pop in to the college!



2 apply for a course

Students can do this online, over the phone or in person - school students sometimes apply via Start.



3 your interview

We will email students to choose their interview date and time.



4 student offer

Students will receive an offer from us. If for any reason we can't offer them a place, we will work with them to find an alternative option.

5 taster days

An opportunity for students to check that the course is right for them. We will contact them with a suitable time and date, so they can come down and see what it's like.



6 enrol with us

Students will be invited to come in and enrol on their chosen date and time, where they can collect information about their first week and course timetables.



7 start college



GCSE Results Day

A representative from Leeds City College can attend your school on A level or GCSE results days. Staff from the college will be available to support students who need information about alternative options, as well as those who have already applied to Leeds Sixth Form College and need information about the enrolment process.

Information for students

- Time off school might be needed for the interview.
- Everyone who has applied will be contacted by email in the first instance.
- Everyone who has applied will receive a reminder text message on the day of the interview.
- On the interview day, offer cards are given out with course details and other useful information.
- If the course applied for isn't right, we will help find an alternative.

When enrolling, the following are needed:

1. One form of identification from the below:

- Passport
- Driving Licence
- Official Photo ID
- National Identity Card
- National Insurance Card
- Utility Bill
- JCP Documentation
- Benefits Evidence
- Exam Certificate
- Debit or Credit Card

2. National Insurance number (including card, letter or email)

3. Copies of examination results, students will not be able to enrol without this information.
